

MACC officials said to have met Najib

KUALA LUMPUR: Officials from the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC), including its chief Tan Sri Abu Kassim Mohamed, are said to have met Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak in Parliament.

The meeting yesterday was believed to be in relation to the RM2.6bil donation in the Prime Minister's bank account, which is part of a wider investigation by the anti-graft body into 1Malaysia Development Bhd and its subsidiary, SRC International.

Abu Kassim was seen leaving Parliament at around noon.

The meeting reportedly took place at the Prime Minister's office located in the Parliament tower. Several Finance Ministry officials were also seen entering the building in a separate vehicle.

MACC sources had revealed that the anti-graft body would record a statement from Najib, although it remained unclear where and when this would take place.

It is believed that yesterday's meeting was to arrange a suitable date and time for the Commission to question Najib.

The Prime Minister had recently committed to giving a statement to MACC to assist in the ongoing probe, saying that he was advised to do so by Attorney-General Tan Sri Mohd Apandi Ali as it would hasten the investigations.
